

EVERYONE IS UNIQUE

Students are different in how they learn, what they enjoy, and in their educational goals. One of the great advantages of home schooling is the tremendous opportunity to fit the educational program to each child.

FLEXIBILITY IS KEY

Although we recommend specific texts, we work with you whenever other texts are desired. We also allow the creation of courses we do not currently offer (e.g., logic, SAT Prep, zoology).

PEOPLE LEARN BEST THROUGH ACTIVITY

We emphasize active participation on the students' parts in the learning process. For example, our history courses include many projects to allow students to learn and show what they've learned, through reading, writing, researching, drawing, building, acting, and even singing, rather than simply taking tests.

EDUCATION IS NOT ALL IN BOOKS

Therefore, we offer credit for work and volunteer experience, as well as educational travel. These experiences help develop such traits as discipline, compassion, and integrity. We've had students receive credit for such diverse activities as mission endeavors, running a business, training horses, acting as a museum guide, and traveling.

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CRITICAL THINKING IS VITAL

Students need to learn how to think, to differentiate between fact and opinion, and to do research. Our approach emphasizes research, primary sources, and opinion essays.

INDEPENDENCE SHOULD BE FOSTERED

We want to become acquainted with our enrollees. We encourage our students to take charge of their education and to contact us with questions or problems (of course, parents can do the same).

Senior High Services

WHAT YOU GET

We provide structure, guidance, grades, credits, transcripts, and diplomas. Counseling is also available by letter, phone, fax, or e-mail. Letter grades are given each quarter, but they are a small part of the evaluations. In addition, your student's work will receive personal attention, often with specific suggestions for improvement. Our evaluators strive to be supportive, realistic, and educational in their comments.

WHAT YOU DO

Submit the registration form on pages 27–28 and payment for either the full year or the first month. When we receive the registration form, we will mail a student I.D. card, questionnaires to complete and return, and a High School Handbook. Questionnaires are also available on line to expedite your enrollment. Someone will call or e-mail once the questionnaires are received to help you make course/text choices. You have 12 months to complete your academic year.

GRADUATION

Upon completion of all Hewitt requirements, a diploma is issued. To qualify for our diploma, students must complete a minimum of 21 credits of study and score satisfactorily on an achievement test, college board exam, or GED. If you submit your state's graduation requirements, we can build a program to match them. Our diplomas and credits have been accepted by the armed forces, public and private high schools, community colleges, and universities.

TRANSFER STUDENTS

Our high school is a four-year program. We welcome transfer students and will work with them to accept as many courses as possible. We will also provisionally accept a parent's transcript of a home-schooled student's high school credits.

ACCREDITATION

We have chosen not to become accredited by the government or by an independent accrediting agency, because we do not want an accrediting body to dictate the courses, textbooks, and teachers that we must employ. Many state and private colleges and universities are accepting students without an accredited diploma. You can ask for a copy of a list of approximately 75 colleges/univ. that have accepted Hewitt's transcript/diploma.

These students should take the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) or the American College Test (ACT) early in their junior or senior year.

Students using *Lightning Literature* may submit each English paper electronically for teachers to correct within two weeks of receipt and return them via email. Grades will still be assigned at the end of the quarter. Students may also elect to submit all the English papers at the end of each quarter. Single-Course Option

Perhaps you feel comfortable grading all subjects but English or history. Or maybe you want to test our program before investing in a full-time package. You can enroll in a single course and get evaluations, phone help, and transcript for any class. Our English program probably gets the most compliments. We set out to challenge your student to constantly work on and improve his or her ability to communicate clearly. This applies not only to grammar, punctuation, sentence structure, etc., but also to the content itself. We expect the student's move from our high-school senior English program to any college to be almost unnoticeable. If you are looking for some help, but not for everything, we think you and your student will appreciate the input.

We particularly like *Vocabulary from the Classical Roots* (Note: most of the Vocabulary for Enjoyment books are now out of print.) You should also have an English Handbook to use as a resource when writing. We particularly like the Write Source Handbooks (www.greatsource.com), but you need buy only one handbook for junior high and one for senior high (not one every year).

If you are doing the "Basic" English program, you will also need to incorporate grammar into your studies. Again, you may choose any program you wish.
