

# Adjectives—Comparative and Superlative Answer Key

This worksheet reviews the comparative and superlative of adjectives.

In these sentences, students are to put the adjectives in the comparative or superlative form, depending on what makes sense. The adjectives to use are in order at the end of the sentences.

1. Jerome got even madder at Rex when they were later than Calen.    mad    late
2. Because Liam had to get up the earliest, he was sleepier than everyone else in the family.    early    sleepy
3. Because this shirt is the largest, it is also the loosest.  
large    loose
4. The fattest dog of the pack was also the slowest.  
fat    slow
5. The oak tree is taller than the maple, but it's also sturdier.  
tall    sturdy
6. It's the hottest day of the year, so please don't ask me to move any faster.    hot    fast
