Plot

Plot is basically another word for story. Before you start writing your story, it's a good idea to know what happens. Write down the basic events in your story so you know where you're going. Before you write "Once upon a time," know that the hare is going to challenge the tortoise to a race, the hare is going to take a nap, and the tortoise is going to win the race.

Stories have a beginning, a middle, and an end. The beginning introduces your world and most or even all of your characters. The middle gives the characters things to do. What does your main



character want? How do they go after it? What keeps them from getting it (at least for awhile)? The end of the story tells us whether the character got what they wanted and how. It also shows us how the character or maybe even the world changed.
