Most of writing is rewriting. When rewriting a research paper, here is a checklist of what to review to improve your rough draft. I have separated these into groups. Focus on the first group on your first rewrite of the essay, the second group on the second rewrite, and the third group when writing your final draft.

All facts are accurate.



Review 1

•	 All data (numbers) are accurate.
•	 Your thesis is clear.
•	 All facts relate to the thesis.
•	 Each paragraph has a focus.
•	 Each paragraph's focus relates to your thesis.

There are no run-on sentences.

Review 2

	There are no comma splices.
•	There are no fragments.
•	There are no rambling sentences.
•	There is a variety of short, medium-length, and long sentences.

If a chart or graph is included, its content is accurate.

•	There is a variety of simple, compound, and complex sentences.		
•	There are no exclamatory sentences.		
•	There are transition words and sentences to improve the flow of the paper.		
•	When possible, words are vivid and interesting.		
•	If possible, descriptions involve multiple senses.		
•	If a chart or graph is included, it is mentioned in the main text.		
•	Any charts or graphs are labeled and easy to read.		
Review 3			
•	All capitalization is correct.		
•	All punctuation is correct.		
•	Any other grammar rules you know are followed correctly.
